# Extension of expiry date for national authorisation – Butinox Futura Grunning – NO-2011-0006

We refer to the authorisation of the biocidal product Butinox Futura Grunning – NO-2011-0006 containing the active substance tebuconazole. The Norwegian Environment Agency hereby extend the expiry date until 30 September 2022.

## Background

The Commission has adopted by means of an Implementing act, a Commission Implementing Decision on the terms and conditions of the authorisation of the biocidal product in accordance with Article 15 of Regulation (EU) No. 528/2012 (the Biocidal Product Regulation, BPR) concerning the making available on the market and use of biocidal products. Regulation (EU) No. 528/2012 is implemented in Norwegian law through the Norwegian Biocide Regulation of 18 April 2017 No. 480.

Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2019/1951 of 25 November 2019 postpones the expiry date of the approval of tebuconazole for use in biocidal products of product type 8 until 30 September 2022.

### **Evaluation**

In Norway, the expiry date for Butinox Futura Grunning is currently 16.11.2021. However, the biocidal product contains the active substance tebuconazole with a renewal process overlapping the pending renewal of the biocidal product. Since the approval of tebuconazole for use in biocidal products of product-type 8 has been extended, it is appropriate to also extend the expiry date for the product authorisation for Butinox Futura Grunning accordingly.

#### Decision

The Norwegian Environment Agency hereby confirms that the expiry date of the authorisation granted for Butinox Futura Grunning has been extended until 30 September 2022 in accordance with the Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2019/1951 of 25 November 2019, cf. the Norwegian Biocides Regulation § 3-1.

Apart from the extension of the expiry date outlined above, the authorisation conditions as stated in the authorisation letter dated 21 November 2011 are valid.



No fee will be charged regarding the change of the expiry date.

## **Appeal**

The decision can be appealed to the Ministry of Climate and Environment, in accordance with Article 28 of the Public Administration Act. The complaint must be submitted to the Norwegian Environment Agency within 3 weeks after receipt of this letter, in accordance with Article 29 of the Public Administration Act.
