I. Summary record of the proceedings

Item 1 - Welcome and introduction

1.1 Welcome and opening the BPRS Chair and Vice Chairs

The BPRS Chair welcomed all the participants and opened the meeting. He announced that the members from the 26 EU Member States with voting rights and the three EEA countries and Switzerland were attending, physically and remotely. The Chair informed that the quorum requirement was met.

1.2 Welcome by ECHA's Executive Director

The ECHA's Executive Director introduced herself and welcomed that BPRS and ECHA will continue the good cooperation in the future.

1.3 Adoption of the agenda and declarations of conflicts of interest

The Chair indicated the changes in the agenda. The agenda was adopted (Annex 1).

No conflicts of interest were declared at the meeting according to Article 9(2) of the Rules of Procedure.

1.4 Status of action points and written procedures from BPRS-18

Forum members took note of the status of the action points from the last plenary meeting, where all were done/closed. The Chair referred to the document with the results of the written procedures between BPRS-18 and BPRS-19.

The Chair informed about the discussions that took place during the meeting with the ECHA management on 22 May 2023.

Item 2 - Election of the BPRS Chair and Vice Chairs

The BPRS elected a new chair and vice chair: Helmut de Vos (BE) as chair and Jenny Karlsson (SE) and Eugen Anwander (AT) as vice chairs. They start their roles on 26 June 2023 in a three years mandate.

Item 3 - BPRS enforcement activities

3.1 Forum-BPRS WG Prioritization - discussion and potential decision on the scope of the next BEF project

The WG chair presented the outcome of the prioritisation of the proposals for BPRS projects received by the WG. The WG concluded on the shortlist of three project proposals for BEF-3.

The BPRS members discussed the options presented and concluded that the next project will focus on the enforcement of the Summary of Product Characteristics (SPC) and possibly the SDSs for biocides during on-site and desktops checks.



3.2 Training for national inspectors 2023

The WG Chair updated the plenary about the progress made by the WG. The preparatory phase of the sixth training event will be held under the umbrella of the BPRS was kicked off in April 2023. The WG members analysed the topics proposed by the BPRS members and submitted to the BPRS-19 a draft agenda of the training.

The event will be focused on Summary of Product Characteristic (SPC) for biocides and related information on labels (basic level); BPR borderline issues; and critical/forbidden claims. The event will be delivered remotely on 1 December 2023 (no prior registration will be needed).

The WG members would consider to involve the ECHA Biocidal Products Committee to better investigate specific aspects of the SPC, and DG SANTE concerning 'potentially misleading terms' and biocides borderline issues.

3.3 BEF-2 - presentation of the project's preliminary results

The WG Chair presented to the BPRS members the preliminary results of the BEF-2. The WG will consult the draft report with the national coordinators and BPRS members in September 2023. The WG aimed at finalising the report by the BPRS-20. BEF-2 findings might be shared with ASOs at the next Open Session in November 2023.

Item 4 - Enforcement of BPR in the Member States

4.1 Enforcement practices in BE

The BPRS took note of the overall enforcement of Biocidal products as part of a closed circuit in Belgium.

4.2 Enforcement experience of biocidal products containing active chlorine

The BPRS took note of the investigation made in Switzerland that was triggered by the increase in quantity and as well in number of different disinfectants but also an extraordinary increase in disinfectants containing active chlorine from new companies.

4.3 Enforcement practices in BG

The BPRS took note of the information on the regime applied by Bulgaria during the transitional period, pursuant the BPR.

Item 6 – Break-out group discussions on the results of BEF-2

The WG Chair introduced the objective of the break-out groups, namely sharing ideas and suggestions to improve the draft BEF-2 report. Discussions were mainly steered questions addressed by the BEF-2 WG members, acting as moderators.

Example of questions touched upon during the meeting were: what are the most difficult problems with biocidal products on national markets; what the WG should highlight in the BEF-2 report; what problems national inspectors encountered during the BEF-2 inspections. Key notes from the discussion will be taken into account when elaborating the BEF-2 report.



Item 7 - Updates on developments by the European Commission

7.1 Update from DG SANTE

The BPRS took note of the information on active substances, in particular about Iodine/PVP iodine and the second renewal anticoagulant rodenticides. The COM representative also informed about the discussion on trade names in the CA meeting and Article 69(2), the union authorisation (finding an evaluating Competent Authority, quality of Summary of Product Characteristic (SPC) and translations) and an update of derogations under Article 55. Additionally, it was brough to the attention of the BPRS a scope issue concerning products with mode of action at molecular level.

The COM clarified that the COM did not intend to draft a guide for enforcers regarding the SPCs. A list of non-allowed terms and legal statements would be available in the CA document. Although it is not a legal document, this type of document serves to harmonise the BPR implementation among Member States.

Item 8 - Practical issues for enforcement

The Chair updated the plenary about the ongoing discussion on the BPRS Practical Issue (i.e. BPRS-18.1) on labelling of biocidal products. The Practical Issue went through two rounds of written consultation, and a revised draft conclusion was submitted to the BPRS-19 accordingly. The BPRS adopted the conclusion, and HET was tasked to include it in the BPRS Manual of Conclusions (which is available in S-CIRCABC). HET also informed that the Manual of Conclusions might be translated over the coming months.

Item 9 - Cooperation with other networks

9.1 Update from the Forum activities

The Forum Chair debriefed the BPRS on the decisions taken at Forum-45. The Forum elected Henrik Hedlund (SE) as chair and Katja vom Hofe (DE) and Maria Orphanou (CY) as Vice-Chairs. The mandate of new chairs will start on 22/06/2023.

The Forum agreed that the new REF project will focus on the enforcement of chemical products sold online and a new WG was set-up to examine impacts on the Forum of the future REACH, CLP revision and Basic Regulation.

The Forum discussed the first draft work programme prepared by the drafting group composed of Forum/BPRS members, NL, IE members and HET. The new work programme will be concise and describe enforcement priorities, meta-priorities and activities in 2-year perspective 2024-2025. The BPRS members were invited to liaise with the Forum members to provide comments on the work programme.

9.2 Update from ADCO Chairs meeting and European Product Compliance network (EUPCN)

The Chair informed about the EUPCN meetings in March and May 2023. He informed that the EU PCN work programme for 2023 and 2024 was adopted and noted that a substantial portion of topics addressed were not of a direct relevance for BPR.



One item of interest was regarding the improvements of ICSMS1 planned to be complete by 2024. He suggested to schedule a session on ICSMS and its relevance under the BPR at a future meeting.

Some participants shared that information in ICSMS was very incomplete and thus not reliable for reporting purpose. They follow the Forum's recommendation to record in the tool only the non-compliance cases where an in-depth control has been performed. Recording in ISCMS was found to be quite burdensome as in some cases there were also national tools that the inspector needs to be use and fill in.

Item 10 - AOBs

10.1 Result of the satisfaction survey 2022

The BPRS took note of the document with the compiled results of the satisfaction survey, concerning the Forum and BPRS activities during 2022. Forum, BPRS and WG members and alternates were the target audience of this survey.

The results will be assessed by the Forum and BPRS chairs during the summer and brought for the next plenaries for discussion with the members.

10.2 Dates of BPRS plenaries in 2024

The BPRS took note of the dates of the meetings in 2024:

- BPRS-21 on 14-15 March (Forum-46 on 18-22 March)
- BPRS-22 on 13-14 June (Forum-47 on 10-14 June) (Helsinki)
- BPRS-23 on 14-15 November (Forum-48 on 18-23 Nov)

HET will request budget for a second physical meeting in 2024. In case it is approved, one of the meetings (March or November) will be adjacent to the Forum meeting dates.

10.3 Austrian NEA observation concerning a biocidal product "B401 CERTAN" made available on the market which acts against wax moths in bee hives

The BPRS took note of the case brought by the AT BPRS member. The BPRS members were invited to share whether there were similar cases in their countries and what were their enforcement approach.

Mandate: According to the working procedure for the prioritisation and selection of REF and BEF projects, the WG shall:

- 1. Review annually a list of proposals for REF and BEF, when needed, projects submitted by Forum members, ECHA Secretariat, the Commission and the Stakeholder Organisations accredited by ECHA (ASOs);
- 2. Prioritise the subjects by applying Forum's methodology for the prioritisation, selection and management of REF and BEF projects
- 3. Draft a recommendation proposing the subject for the next REF and BEF project
- 4. Elaborate and update an inventory of project recommendations and a registry of legal obligations subject to previous enforcement projects in the following regulatory areas: REACH, CLP, PIC, POP, BPR.
- 5. Propose to the Forum topics for pilot and small-scale projects as an output of the prioritisation exercise where appropriate.
- 6. In addition, the WG will revise, when needed, the methodology for the prioritisation, selection and management of REF and BEF projects and implementing its working procedures to be adopted by the Forum.

The WG will operate from Forum-31 (November 2018) until the end of 2023 (end of the Forum MAWP 2019 - 2023). The mandate of the WG can be renewed to operate after this period.
