



Appointment of Committee Members

44th meeting of the Management Board 13-14 December 2016

Proposal

The Management Board is invited to appoint candidates for the Committee for Risk Assessment (RAC) and the Committee for Socio-economic Analysis (SEAC) membership.

RAC

The Management Board appoints 10 re-nominations. If the Management Board re-appoints these members, RAC will have 53 members (including 4 co-opted members).

SEAC

The Management Board appoints 12 re-nominations and 2 new candidate (nominated by Romania and Netherlands). If the Management Board appoints these members, SEAC will have 43 members (including 4 co-opted members).

Background

Each Member State may nominate candidates to membership of RAC and SEAC. The Executive Director is required to establish a list of nominees, which is published on the ECHA website. The Management Board shall appoint the members of the Committee from this list, including at least one member but no more than two from the nominees of each Member State. Members shall be appointed for their experience in performing the tasks specified in the REACH Regulation. Further, the membership of Committee members appointed for a term of three years shall be renewable. In order to safeguard the independence, integrity and credibility of the Committees, Member States were asked to make their nominations in accordance with the eligibility criteria adopted by the Management Board at its 31st Meeting on 26-27 September 2013.

A letter dated 13 September 2016 was sent by the Secretariat to those Member State Permanent Representations which are due to (re-)nominate candidates to membership of RAC and SEAC.

Member States were asked for written commitment (see nomination forms attached) to provide adequate scientific and technical resources to the nominated member and to enable him/her to use at least half of his/her working time for this task. Commitment to provide such support has been received from the Member States for all the nominees.

Rationale

Candidates for renewal of RAC membership

The Member States proposed the renewal of the membership of the following 10 RAC members whose 3-year term will expire in the period 1 January 1 – 30 June 2017. If their renewal is decided by the Management Board, the new term of these members will start on the day after the expiry date of their current term of office, as indicated below:

The declarations of interests of these members raise no issues regarding their eligibility for membership.

New candidates for SEAC membership

Two Member States have nominated the following new candidates:

Romania ZAMFIR Adrian-Stefan

The nominee Mr ZAMFIR Adrian-Stefan is employed as a research scientist at the National Institute for Research and Development in Environmental Protection (Bucharest, Romania). His main fields of expertise in Socio-economic Analysis include assessment of costs and benefits in relation to effects on the human health and the environment as well as in-depth expertise on assessment of the effectiveness and the costs linked to risk management options. The expertise of the proposed nominee is in line with the SEAC needs and his declaration of interest does not raise any issues of concern, making him eligible for membership of the Committee.

Netherlands JANSSEN Martinus Petrus Mattheus

The nominee Mr JANSSEN Martinus Petrus Mattheus is employed as a senior scientist at the National Institute of Public Health and the Environment (Bilthoven, The Netherlands). His main fields of expertise in socio-economic analysis include availability of alternatives as well as socio-economic impact of risk management options. The expertise of the proposed nominee is in line with the SEAC needs and his declaration of interest does not raise any issues of concern, making him eligible for membership of the Committee.

Candidates for renewal of SEAC membership

The Member States proposed the renewal of the membership of the following 12 SEAC members whose 3-year term will expire in the period 1 January – 30 June 2017. If their renewal is decided by the Management Board, the new term of these members will start on the day after the expiry date of their current term of office, as indicated below:

These SEAC members are experts with proven expertise in different areas relevant for the work of SEAC and have made valuable contributions to the Committee during their previous period of memberships. The declarations of interests of these members raise no issues regarding their eligibility for membership.

Alternative options

The Management Board could decide to not appoint a second member nominated by a given Member State. This would be contradictory to the requests made for nominating a 2nd member and detrimental to the efforts to strengthen the capacity of the Committees for coping with their high workload. No other candidates have been proposed and there are therefore no alternative candidates to appoint.

Drawbacks

The only visible disadvantage of the proposal lies in the costs related to reimbursement of members. The benefits of the additional expertise outweigh these costs by far.
