Extension of expiry date for national authorisation – impralit ACA protect family – NO-2020-0190

We refer to the R4BP 3 communication of 22 June 2022, concerning the expiry date of the authorisation of the biocidal product family impralit ACA protect family containing the active substances propiconazole, basic copper carbonate and tebuconazole. The Norwegian Environment Agency hereby extend the expiry date until 9 June 2023.

Background

The Commission has adopted by means of an Implementing act, a Commission Implementing Decision on the terms and conditions of the authorisation of the biocidal product in accordance with Article 15 of Regulation (EU) No. 528/2012 (the Biocidal Product Regulation, BPR) concerning the making available on the market and use of biocidal products. Regulation (EU) No. 528/2012 is implemented in Norwegian law through the Norwegian Biocide Regulation of 18 April 2017 No. 480.

According to Article 50 of the BPR, an authorisation holder seeking to change any of the information in relation to the initial application of the authorisation of the product shall apply to the Competent Authorities of the relevant Member State having authorised the biocidal product concerned. Those competent authorities shall decide whether the term and conditions of the authorisation need to be amended.

The reference Member State for the re-evaluation, Czech Republic, has prolonged the expiry date for their national authorisation until 9 June 2023 due to delays in the evaluation. The applicant has asked us to extend the expiry date accordingly.

Evaluation

In Norway, the expiry date is currently 9 June 2022. The authorisation holder has confirmed that they seek to extending the expiry date for the product in Norway. In addition, the reference Member State for the re-evaluation, Czech Republic, has already extended their national authorisation until 9 June 2023. As a concerned Member State, the Norwegian Environment Agency follows the decision made by the reference Member State.

Decision

The Norwegian Environment Agency hereby confirms that the expiry date of the authorisation granted for impralit ACA protect family has been extended until 9 June 2023 according to Article 50 of Regulation (EU) No. 528/2012 concerning amendment of an authorisation at the request of the authorisation holder.

Apart from the extension of the expiry date outlined above, the authorisation conditions as state in the authorisation letter dated 17 August 2020 are valid.

No fee will be charged regarding the change of the expiry date.

Appeal

The decision can be appealed to the Ministry of Climate and Environment, in accordance with Article 28 of the Public Administration Act. The complaint must be submitted to the Norwegian Environment Agency within 3 weeks after receipt of this letter, in accordance with Article 29 of the Public Administration Act.
