19-21 March 2024

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I. Summary record of the proceedings

Item 1 - Welcome and introduction

1.1 Welcome and opening by the Forum Chair

The Forum Chair welcomed all the participants and opened the meeting. He announced that the Forum members from 27 EU Member States with voting rights and the three EEA countries were attending. The Chair informed that the quorum requirement was met.

1.2 Adoption of the agenda

The Chair indicated the changes in the agenda. The agenda was adopted (Content IV, Annex 1).

1.3 Declarations of conflicts of interest with regard to agenda items

No conflicts of interest were declared at the meeting according to Article 9(2) of the Rules of Procedure.

1.4 State of play with action points from Forum-45

Forum members took note of the status of the action points from Forum-45 as listed in the meeting document.

1.5 Results of the written procedures and other issues between Forum-45 and Forum-46

The Chair referred to the document with the results of the written procedures between Forum-45 and Forum-46.

The Chair reported he attended the "Shaping tomorrow" conference, on 28 February in ECHA, in which ECHA's stakeholders and general public (e.g. consultants, representatives from Industry) participated. There was a high-level discussion on the direction of developments of the chemicals legislation and enforcement was mentioned as highly relevant.

Additionally, he attended also in ECHA, on 29 February, the Head of Chemical authorities (HCA) meeting. Several speakers expressed the importance and their appreciation for the Forum projects and that the increase of private imports and e-commerce remained an issue. The enforcement activities in small countries were increasingly burdensome and needed to be targeted. The Member States reported they were struggling with recruitment and with finding people with the right expertise.

In both meetings, Forum had a stand with information about the Forum's work and where participants could talk with HET staff and Forum Chair during the breaks. There was high interest during the ECHA Conference, mainly from consultants and ASOs, but lower interest during the HCA.

Item 2 - Forum's new projects and tasks

2.1 Next Forum pilot project on Poison Centre Notifications - Mandate set-up

The Forum set up the mandate of the WG on pilot project on notifications to the Poison Centres. The WG would prepare the project manual until the end of 2024 and the inspections will run from January until June 2025. It is expected for the project report to be finalised by the end of 2025.

Item 3 - Forum's enforcement activities - Ongoing projects

3.1 REF-13 on online sales II

3.1.1 Scope of the project

The WG Chair highlighted to the Forum the current timeline of the CLP revision and the possibility that the new CLP version would not be enforceable during the operational phase of REF-13. Therefore, the Forum voted and agreed for REF-13 to focus on duties enforceable by that time, i.e. the "old" CLP provisions.

The Forum also agreed to cover the proposed articles of the other regulations to be checked in the project.

3.1.2 Mandate amendment

The Forum adopted the updated mandate (Annex 2b).

3.2 Pilot project on classification of mixtures focusing on detergents and cleaning products

3.2.1 Enforcement Guide

The WG Chair informed the plenary that the draft guide for the enforcement of mixture classification was consulted with the Forum members between November 2023 and January 2024. The WG members together with the ECHA experts will finalise the document in the coming months and launch its written adoption.

3.2.2 Mandate amendment

The Forum adopted the updated WG mandate (Annex 2c).

3.3 Projects not for discussion

The Forum addressed and confirmed the mandates of the WGs that were not discussed at the meeting:

- 3.3.1 Prioritisation of REF projects. The Forum adopted the updated mandate (Annex 2d).
- 3.3.2 REF-10 in integrated controls: The Forum adopted the updated mandate (Annex 2e).
- 3.3.3 REF-11 on SDS: The Forum adopted the updated mandate (Annex 2f).
- 3.3.4 REF-12 on the compliance of imported substances, mixtures and articles: The Forum adopted the updated mandate (Annex 2g).
- 3.3.5 Pilot project on enforcement of PFCA and related substances focusing on cosmetics. The operational phase is running until 30 April 2024. The Forum adopted the updated mandate (Annex 2h).
- 3.3.6 WG for examining the enforcement-related impacts on the Forum of the future REACH and CLP revision. This WG will be kept dormant until it is relevant to start its work. The Forum adopted the updated mandate (Annex 2i).

3.3.7 Train the enforcement trainers 2024: The Training 2024 event will take place on 4-5 December 2024 in ECHA premises. The Forum members were invited to nominate two participants per Member State. The Forum adopted the updated mandate (Annex 2j).

Item 4 - Forum's enforcement activities - Projects under finalisation

4.1 Train the enforcement trainers 2023

4.1.1 Final report

The WG prepared and delivered the training in ECHA premises on 22-23 November 2023 on the enforcement of the imports. The WG Chair presented the summary of the training, which 97,6 % of the core participants rated as "good" or "excellent". The WG also outlined some recommendations for future trainings especially on involvement of the remote participants.

The Forum adopted the WG report.

4.1.2 Mandate amendment

The Forum closed the mandate (Annex 2k).

Item 5 - Suggestions for improvement of the inspectors' training on best practices identified in Forum projects

The Forum Chairs and HET presented their suggestions how inspectors can be better trained in the learnings and best practices identified in the Forum projects. It was proposed to start by inviting inspectors and national coordinators to participate in the workshop prepared for ASOs in the follow-up phase of each project. There would be an open session where the results of the project are presented and stakeholders can share their issues. In the same workshop but on a separate closed session, inspectors and national coordinators only will have an opportunity to convey their experiences about the project.

The Forum agreed to try this approach for the REF-10 Workshop on 24 April 2024.

The Forum members were invited to consider the proposal and re-discuss it at Forum-47.

Item 6 - Interlinks

6.1 Enforcement of ECHA decisions

6.1.1 Enforcement of Failure to respond (FTR) letters

The Forum took note of the experiences in the enforcement of Dossier Evaluation Decisions and in particular with the cases of cease of manufacture. The presenter welcomed the views of other Forum members if such cases have been encountered and if they agreed with the actions taken by the presenter's authority.

6.1.2 Improvement of the DEv decision's process

The Forum was reminded of the follow-up of the DEv process and on the status of the follow-up decisions currently sent for enforcement.

It was highlighted that the review of the Interlinks guide was being finalised and needed time to be implemented. Therefore, it was suggested for the cases on-hold from last year to be sent out at a later stage.

6.2 Interlinks guide update

The Forum took note of the current state of the update of the guide, where all the comments received were implemented. The status report was simplified and there was clarification on some of the DEV/SEV processes.

The drafting group will continue the review and it was expected to be finalised for adoption in June.

6.3 Documents only for information: Follow-up of ECHA Decisions

The Forum took note on the statistics about the cases sent to the Member States Focal points until 1 March 2024.

Item 7 - Enforcement in the Member States (part I)

7.1 Chemicals legislation in Iceland and the role of the Environment Agency

The Forum took note of the organisation of the enforcement authorities in Iceland.

7.2 Enforcement practices in Italy

The Forum took note of the Italian organisation and trend of activities, as well as the experience in cooperation between customs and NEA, on a Classification/Labeling Platform for inspectors and the experiences with end-of-waste.

Some Forum members welcomed the classification and labelling platform and wanted to receive more information. It could be explored whether it could be shared and be available in other languages.

7.3 Follow-up from the Dutch case on SCC registration dossiers

The Forum took note of the Dutch case that potentially affected several Member States.

Item 9 - Forum's enforcement activities - Ongoing projects

9.1 Enforceability of Restrictions

9.1.1 WG progress report

The WG Chair presented the plan of the activities of the WG for the year.

9.1.2 Mandate amendment

The Forum adopted the updated mandate (Annex 21).

9.2 Member States on Partnership for Assessment of Risks from Chemicals (PARC) project on analytical methods

The Forum took note of the project being developed by PARC on analytical methods, part of its activity 6.4.3 "Developing information transfer structures and enforcement methodology for chemicals in articles to support the transition to a circular economy". This project would generate reports aimed at regulators and the Forum members welcomed to be consulted. The PARC project was invited to provide regular updates to the Forum on the status of its project.

The Forum members shared the importance of this work and how it could be of interest to the WG Restrictions and its compendium of analytical methods.

Item 10 - Potential Forum advice on the enforceability of new restriction under the Battery regulation

ECHA presented the objectives of the Battery Regulation and the anticipated tasks ECHA will be mandated under this regulation. It was not clear in the Battery regulation whether there is a legal mandate for the Forum enforceability advice in the Battery Regulation restrictions process, hence ECHA was exploring this with the COM.

Item 11 - Update on relevant developments by the Commission

The COM representative presented the status of the CLP revision and the potential changes included in the legal text, as well as the planned next steps towards finalisation.

Another COM representative suggested to have a presentation of the Forum's work in one of the future CARACAL meetings. He also proposed a new topic for a Forum project and was advised to submit it as proposal to be assessed by the WG Prioritisation when selection the topics for REF-14.

The Forum took note of the updates on several restriction proposals (Chromium, DMAC/NEP) and entries (formaldehyde, Diisocyanates, Microplastics), on the status of the Basic Regulation and on potential joint actions under the Market Surveillance Regulation.

The Chair welcomed clarification and application of the new Taric codes introduced to indicate compliance with POPs restrictions.

Item 12 - Practical issues for enforcement of REACH, CLP, PIC and POPs

Forum discussed three practical issues relevant to enforcement in break-out groups, issues 46.1 on PFOAs in firefighting foam, 46.2 on labels on tattoo ink and 46.3 on SDS provided via QR code.

The comments gathered from the discussions will be processed by HET to generate the next versions of the draft conclusions of the issues, which will then be consulted with the Forum members.

Forum members were invited to submit new practical issues by 22 April 2024.

Item 14 - Enforcement in the Member States (part II)

14.1 Enforcement practices in Liechtenstein

The Forum took note of the organisation of the enforcement authorities and their activities in Liechtenstein.

14.2 Enforcement practices in Luxemburg

The Forum took note of the organisation of the enforcement authorities and their activities in Luxemburg.

14.3 Enforcement in Norway

The Forum took note of the organisation of the enforcement authorities and their activities in Norway.

Item 15 - Enforcement of specific REACH restrictions entries

15.1 Experiences from the enforcement of the diisocyanate restriction

An alternate member presented the experiences of the national labour inspectors on assessing the training requirements of this restriction. This restriction raised a lot of interest and it was found some disparities in the trainings provided. Further solutions might need to be addressed.

15.2 Input from France for the future guidance on the formaldehyde restriction

The Forum member from France presented the result of the study performed in a French scientific centre and would welcome that these findings were taken into consideration for the guidance on the formaldehyde restriction.

15.2.1 ECHA's plans for the guidance on the formaldehyde restriction

ECHA informed that they received mandate from the COM to prepare a guideline on formaldehyde releases from articles and formaldehyde concentration in the interior of vehicles. The guideline will be developed by ECHA (starting April-May 2024), in close collaboration with the European Commission. Forum members were invited to express interest to collaborate as an expert in the preparatory phase of the guideline.

Item 16 - Updates from the ECHA Secretariat

16.1 Visibility of the communication of Forum's outputs

ECHA's Communication officer presented the statistics related to the communication of the Forum's latest projects REF-10 and BEF-2. Additionally, he raised some ideas to improve the cooperation and the visibility of Forum's outputs.

The Member States Communicators Network was seen as a body to be more active as a multiplier of ECHA's publications. Forum members were invited to contact their national communication officers to promote Forum's work.

It was also highlighted that projects targeting consumer products have the potential to reach a broader audience. Hence, while drafting the report, the Forum could emphasise information (and examples) of such products as well as include some recommendations to the consumers.

16.2 Activities of the Regulatory Support team

The Forum took note of the support provided to companies via the ECHA Helpdesk and the national Helpdesks as well as the main issues discussed in the Helpnet. The most recent activity of the regulatory support team was to assist the instrument for pre-accession (IPA) countries to enhance the readiness of the beneficiaries to assume their role in their path towards EU membership in the area of EU legislation for chemical management.

16.3 New ECHA dissemination website

Forum took note of ECHA's new system (<u>ECHA CHEM</u>) that will gradually replace the current dissemination website and was launched on 30 January 2024. A demonstration was given of how the information was displayed. The first release included only information on registered substances. There will be further releases by the end of the year when more data will be included.

16.4 Forum plenary dates in 2025

The Forum took note of the weeks of the plenary meetings planned for 2025:

Item 17 - Cooperation with other networks

17.1 Forum's contribution to the EU Product Compliance Network (EUPCN) and the ADCO Chairs' meetings

The Forum took note of the meeting document with the summary of the various meetings attended by the Forum Chair and Vice-Chair.

17.2 Updates from SLIC-CHEMEX

The Forum took note of the information presented in the meeting document.

Item 18 - Debriefing of the meeting with ECHA Directors

The Chair informed the Forum about the discussions that took place during the meeting with ECHA management on 19 March 2024.

On the issue of the physical meetings and ECHA's commitment to the target of becoming carbon-neutral by 2030, some Forum members stressed the importance of the physical meetings and the need to increase its frequency in order for the network to continue to be functional and active. The Forum members were invited to suggest ways in which the Forum could increase the number of physical meetings without increasing the carbon footprint.

Item 19 – Updates from BPR Subgroup

The Forum took note of the activities of the BPRS in their last meeting (BPRS-21).

The BPRS endorsed the BEF-3 scope and the WG will start the preparation of the project manual. BEF-3 project is to focus on the enforcement of the Summary of Product Characteristics (SPC) and elements of SDSs.

The Training for national inspectors 2024 was merged with the training for National Coordinators of the BEF-3 and the event will be delivered in late November 2024.

The BEF-2 WG was finalising the practical guide and preparing for the ASO workshop on 25 March 2024.

There were presentations on national BPR enforcement from CY and CZ and a discussion on the labelling of biocides products with food images, similar with a practical issue discussed in the Forum.

Item 20 - A.O.B.

20.1 Round Robin Testing

The German Forum alternate shared the interest in exchanging information about round robin tests that laboratories in other EU Member States have already performed or would be interested in performing jointly in the future. The aim of this exchange was to further harmonise the methods used for analysing REACH substances.

The Forum members were invited also to provide contact details of laboratories that might be interested in setting up such interlaboratory tests in the future and to participate in laboratory comparisons (organised by Member States) for substances for which round robin tests were not commercially available.

20.2 Enforcement of Entry 28 of Annex XVII of REACH in the Member States

The Austrian Forum member presented a conclusion from the NEAs related to the enforcement of Entry 28 and welcomed the views of the Forum members on the issue.

In particular, this entry is related to "Cumene" (over 0.1 % w/w) which cannot be supplied to the general public and whether private pilots can or cannot be considered as professional users.

20.3 Nordic project

The Forum took note that the Nordic exposure group was conducting a project on the use of SVHC (during 2024, final report in Feb 2025). The focus would be on professional uses only and the use and exposure profiles for substances in different sectors. The Forum members were invited to share information on professional uses of SVHC on their own.

20.4 Diisocyantes

It was raised at the meeting that a presentation from SME United was given at the open session of CARACAL on the issue of Diisocyanates and service providers for the training. The COM recommended to contact the Forum on this issue. The Forum was still discussing this issue and HET would explore with the Regulatory Advice Team in ECHA to develop an advice for SMEs based on the recommendations on the requirements for the training identified by the Forum so far.
